
Highlights

- Very dry conditions persist today with an Increased Threat Of Fire Potential today. Winds are lighter than yesterday, however, humidity remains extremely low.
- Showers move in the from the south Friday night with rainfall becoming moderate to occasionally heavy late Friday night into Saturday. Between 1.5 to up to 3 to 4 inches of rain is possible with the highest amounts east of I -95 to the coast and Eastern Shore.
- Southeast winds increase late Friday and Saturday gusting to 25 to 35 mph, highest near the coast, Bay and NE NC. Winds become northwest Sunday with peak winds gusts around 35 mph inland and near 50 mph along the Bay, coast, and NE NC.
- Minor coastal flooding is likely across the northern Albemarle Sound as well as the Bay and tidal rivers with Saturday and into Sunday.
- Marine Weather Small Craft Advisory condition are expected Friday with a southeast wind. Gale Conditions are expected Saturday as winds shift from the southeast to northwest. This shift in winds will result in dangerous wave conditions along the Bay and coastal waters.





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

Statewide Rainfall Through 72 Hours







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



Marine Threat Potential - Next 5 Days





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








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
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Tidal Flooding Overview



Nuisance	Shallow flooding only in the most vulnerable locations. Expect around a half foot of inundation.						
Minor	Up to 1 foot of inundation possible in vulnerable locations.						
Moderate	1 to 2 feet of inundation expected. Water will extend inland from the waterfront.						
Major	2 to 3 feet or more of inundation expected. Flooding will extend well inland.						


