TOWN COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

Items Approved by Town Council

- Council approved solicitation of applications for vacancies on various boards and commissions. Current vacancies exist on the Tree Committee and the Board of Adjustment. Applications can be found here:

- Council approved hiring a consultant to help update Historic District Design Guidelines. The Town received a \$15,000 grant to help fund this initiative.
- Council approved the creation of a “Young Folks Committee” with the intention of formulating recommendations from people under the age of 40 that would enhance the quality of life for young people in our community. - The Council approved an agreement with the NC Department of Transportation to be the fiscal agent for State funds that NC House Representative Ed Goodwin secured for the Albemarle Sound Passenger Ferry Feasibility Study. The Council expressed appreciation for Representative Goodwin’s leadership on this important project. Plans are in the works for a summer 2020 trial run of a cruise boat for visitors and citizens to Cruise the Sound!
- Council adopted a budget ordinance that will help the Town be reimbursed by FEMA for costs the Town incurred preparing for and recovering from Hurricane Dorian.
- Council approved hiring an attorney for the Board of Adjustment to re-hear Vince Burgher’s appeal to overturn the decision made by the Historic Preservation Commission regarding the painted fence at his property on West King Street, known as Pembroke Hall.
