

Edenton Town Council Minutes
November 25, 2019

The Edenton Town Council met on Monday, November 25, 2019 in the Council Chambers for committee meetings. The following members were present: Mayor Roland Vaughan, Councilman Elton Bond, Councilman Samuel Dixon, Councilman Craig Miller, Councilman Roscoe Poole and Councilman Jimmy Stallings. Absent Councilman Steve Biggs.

Mayor Roland Vaughan called the meeting to order.

The Administrative Committee had three items on the agenda.

Ms. Knighton introduced Tyler Bream who was going to give the update on the Social Media Marketing Campaign that was launched in August 2019.

The second item was the ADA Transition Plan.

Lead for NC Fellow Saoirse Scott gave the update on this item.

This item was recommended to be placed on the next full Council agenda for approval.

The last item was the lease agreement for the 2nd floor of Town Hall.

Ms. Knighton stated that the Council needed to review the terms of the proposed lease agreement for office space on the second floor of Town Hall for Congressman Murphy. She stated that office space would be leased at no cost to the Congressman and it will be staffed by a full time staff member.

This item was recommended to be placed on the next full Council agenda for approval.

The Public Works Committee had one item on the agenda.

Councilman Stallings stated that the item for review was the ordinance for abandoned and derelict vessels.

Lead for NC Fellow Saoirse Scott gave the update on this item. She stated that she, Town Manager Anne-Marie Knighton and Emergency Management Coordinator Cord Palmer attended a workshop on this item.

The Finance Committee had two items on the agenda.

Councilman Dixon stated that the first item was the Ipads approval of private sale to Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem.

Ms. Knighton stated the Ipads would be sold to the outgoing Town Council members for \$50.00.

This item was recommended to be placed on the next full Council agenda for approval.

Councilman Dixon stated that the second item was the grant agreement for Colony Tire building reuse program.

Ms. Knighton stated that the Town was awarded a \$400,000 grant for Colony Tire \$3.2-million-dollar expansion and they are committed to create 40 new jobs and have to match the grant. A promissory note has to be signed by Colony Tire so that if the jobs are not created they agree to pay a pro rata share of the grant and the Town would take a deed of trust on the property.

This item was recommended to be placed on the next full Council agenda for approval.
